Scientific Discussions about Cyberspace Is Essential

Hojjat al-Islam Habibullah Shabani The Imam of Friday Prayer of Hamadan visited the Office of Islamic Studies on cyberspace. He said: we do not have governance in the field of cyberspace, and it is partly due to the fact we do not have governance in culture. He added unfortunately our cultural activities are not carried out from the aspect of governance.

The representative of Wali-Fagih in Hamadan said: Those who were active and present in the violence and demonstrations of death of Mahsa Amini have grown and formed in cyberspace for two or three years. They were in a kind of abstract world, so when they enter the real world, they create such incidents and disturbances. He emphasized the role of the Office of Islamic Studies of the National Center for Cyberspace in the current situation: "We are now saying that we want cyberspace to be managed, but we do not know exactly what we want. For example, sometimes management means filtering, and sometimes it means supporting Iranian messengers; Now it is not clear what we want. The opinions of experts are completely different. We have to come to a conclusion with the dialogue and see where we want to go. You as a research center, should provide a ground for scientific discussions."

Dealing with Problematic Social **Networks**

The free thought meeting of Religion and Cyberspace was held with the topic of «Examination of the Mechanism of Dealing with Problematic Social Networks».

In this meeting, which was held at the Office of Islamic Studies of the National Center for Cyberspace, some experts explained their opinions about filtering and ways to deal with problematic social networks.



Hujjat al-Islam Haj Hosseini, director of the Office of Islamic Studies of the National Center for Cyberspace, said: These global platforms, with the aim of managing governments, have become a problem in countries and these technologies change lifestyles in a targeted manner. But our decisions have never solved this problem, because the proposed solutions have never been as big as the problem. Hujjat al-Islam Haj Hosseini, referring to China's experience, added: China has a large population, and it is itself a global market; However, it does not work nationally. This country know that it must act globally in cyberspace. It has its infrastructure all over the world. Its hardware is available all over the world, many of its softwares are globalized. Thus, if America wants to create a problem for it, China can embargo America elsewhere.

One of the controversial issues these days in Iran, among the elite and common people, is the issue of filtering, especially Instagram filtering.

The Office of Islamic Studies of the National Center for Cyberspace has analyzed the positive and negative opinions of seminary and academic scholars and has finally expressed its opinion in this regard.

It is stated in the introduction of this article: Due to sabotage and disturbance in the country, the Islamic Republic of Iran has blocked access to some foreign social networks, including WhatsApp and Instagram. Some officials' statements indicate that this ban will continue. Therefore, the Office of Islamic Studies of the National Center for Cyberspace discussed this issue among seminarian and university elites and political and management elites, and widely, the opinions of both sides were heard. Then, an analysis of the arguments of supporters and opponents of Instagram filtering from economic, security, cultural and political aspects and the final opinion of this office was presented.

Nigeria Islamic **Court Orders** Arrest Of Local **Celebrities**



An Islamic court in northern Nigeria has ordered police to arrest and investigate 10 local celebrities for "immoral conduct" on social media that could influence youth, a judicial official told AFP Thursday. The court issued the order on Tuesday last week after lawyers filed a lawsuit, calling for their prosecution for singing and dancing to "immoral" songs and sharing them online, Baba-Jibo Ibrahim, a judicial spokesman

The accused celebrities, four men and six women, include a popular hip-hop singer, a famous film actress and eight TikTok influencers with huge followings.

The order highlights strict measures often employed by authorities in Nigeria's Muslim-majority north to regulate social media content and force users to conform to tradition and religious norms.

Sharia law operates alongside criminal and civil law in Nigeria's 12 Muslim-majority northern states.
